TESTIMONY

Dear St. Dismas Guild, I want to thank you so much for your materials and prayers that you've sent me over the years. It enabled me to maintain my connection to God through the Church and helped strengthen my walk and knowledge of Scripture. A little about myself. I was raised Presbyterian, a pretty anti-Catholic group, until I was nine and we moved to another town. My family didn't really attend services as my **father** was rarely home on Sundays because of his job, but my Mom and I would watch a TV Christian program. Then I started attending a Christian school system and their religious services and daily bible classes.

It wasn't really until 10th grade that I accepted Jesus' Lordship over my life and pretty much led a quiet life as a teenager. But I dabbled in credit card fraud after turning 16. At 18 I joined the Navy, serving two years. After my discharge I began to become more and more involved with the credit cards until I finally started to get into trouble with the law. During one of these times I discovered the Catholic Church thru a study of Church history, and **Scott Hahn's studies were a crucial part of my conversion**. I now saw a fuller picture of God's plan and what Jesus' role should be in my life.

The Mass being so beautiful, linking us with all the past, and yet to believers with God in heaven, which I especially feel during Mass at the local Mission parish. But I still struggled over the years with my urge to commit credit card crimes. Now, here I am at 52, doing what I know, with God's guidance, will be my last time being locked up. I will parole in May and I will be homeless, not even having the "clothes on my back." But I hope to go to the local Veterans program. I will keep in touch and hope to help out where I can. God bless you all and DON"T STOP! Your ministry is a crucial one. My love to all of you. In His Grace, Your Brother in Christ. J.E.

Thank you, JE, for sharing. Your testimony shows clearly you are in a battle. Keep drawing your strength from the Lord and His mighty power and put on the armor of God, Ephesians 6. We sent you our book "Overcoming Compulsive Behavior" to help you resist Satan. You can overcome sin because you can do all things through Christ who strengthens you. You belong

to God and you have conquered the evil one for the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world, 1 John 4:4.

DOING TIME WITH JESUS

Dear St. Dismas Guild, This is my testimony. I grew up in a Christian-based family. My parents were never "devout," but we attended most of the Baptist functions. Being here in prison has allowed me to be exposed to the Catholic Church and I have been attracted to its rich history and disciplines. At 16 I discovered the false joys of marijuana, then into drinking and trying every drug I came across.

At 15 I was diagnosed with depression/anxiety disorder by our family doctor. From 15 to 27 years of age I have cycled on and off of just about every popular antidepressant out there. Only now do I really wish to leave the pills alone and trust God with my mind. So, prison has allowed my mind to clear up and see all that I was oblivious to. For example, how my sexual deviancy evolved until it caused this major downfall. I believe God used my sin to completely humble me. He made me to see how much I needed His Son.

I was in utter terror when I came to prison. People like me get brutally beaten or even killed. Lo and behold, I wasn't physically beaten, but mentally and emotionally I was attacked daily. Threatened to be flighted to the hospital, extorted for commissary, and continually told I wasn't human anymore. For months I tried to numb the pain with synthetic marijuana. Quickly I would run out of money, I couldn't escape. Finally, I did get help, I couldn't be there anymore. Call me a snitch, fine, but I had to get out. No person deserves to be treated like that. The fear was worse than death. I died a thousand deaths there. God brought me to a much safer place.

We're all victims of each other; the victimization ends at the Cross. Now I tell God that I will only die once more. Then I shall go to him. We all need the forgiveness and wisdom and love of Christ. I can truly begin to leave the past behind me. I still stumble, but I find my resolve being strengthened each time so that I am able to bounce back quicker. Where do you think that power comes from? I know it isn't from me, but Christ in me. He is in you too. Amen. T.B.

TB, It is God's grace that is giving you the desire to leave the pills alone and trust God "It is God who, in His good will toward you, begets in you any measure of desire or achievement" (Philippians 2:13). He touched you TB. God cares for you and loves you. I am sure He is very pleased that you are trusting Him because He only wants what is good for you. I John 4:18 says, "Love has no room for fear; rather, perfect love casts out all fear." And since fear has to do with punishment, love is not yet perfect in one who is afraid. God loves you with an everlasting love (Jeremiah 31:3). So many others speak of the fear that is so prevalent in prison. It must be awful to be so afraid to even close your eyes. We are so glad you are in a safer place. Continue reminding yourself of His love for you and memorize, Romans

8:38-39 "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

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Hello St. Dismas Guild, I received the New Catechism of the Catholic Church, and thank you and God bless. All the materials you've sent have been awesome and greatly appreciated by me. I'm in a system that appears to be anti-rehabilitation, and I was warned that this county prison is backward. Everything that is "all good" in the real world is "all bad" in prison and vice versa. But your material helps me stay focused on God and bettering myself even if I'm the only one who is concerned about my life or release! God bless, D.B.
